Recovery Operations are continuing in Derry. Though restoration of power has made considerable strides over the weekend, certain areas of the Town, particularly in the Northeast and Southeast portions, remain dark and somewhat cold.

As Derry was struck considerably hard, PSNH is directing some crews released from other regions to the north to Derry, as well as newly arrived crews from out of state.

Three roads remain closed and others, while passable, continue to undergo assessment and clean-up. Caution is advised, owing to debris, downed wires, and diminished shoulders. The closed roads are:

- Beaver Lake / Charlestown Ave
- Fairview / Berry
- South Railroad / Norton

There is no school today in Derry. The schools did come through the storm in good shape and all have power. A decision on Tuesday will be made later today.

Wellness visits continue, checking individuals and areas at risk – offering assistance, information and water as required. The shelter at Londonderry High School is open at this time. Meals, showers, warming and cots are available. Whether the shelter remains open or other accommodation is provided is a decision which will be made later today.

Police staffing has returned to normal levels, as has the call volume. Cones and barricades are being recovered as roadways are made safe.
